- a reaction to higher subscription costs resulting cut-backs

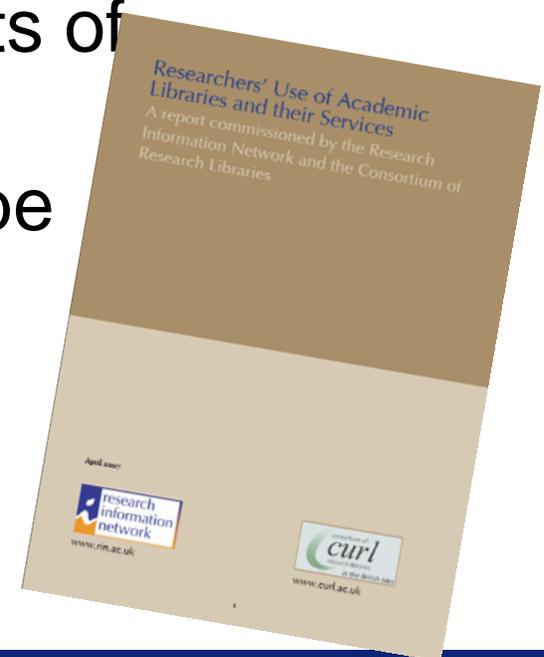




Library Response

”There has been a sharp fall over the past five years in the number of researchers who visit their institution’s library regularly.”

”...researchers told us that the effects of a library’s requirement to service teaching and learning needs can be detrimental to the provision of services underpinning research.”





Research Services

- Services need to be extended to meet new needs of the researchers in the electronic age.
- Scientific communication support with a focus on publication activities is a promising way to extend services.
- The library is not out to preach Open Access, but to support the whole publication process, in which OA is an important part.

Open Access at Lund University

- 1996 First fulltext archiving - dissertations
- 2001 Archiving of research articles
- 2004 Directory of Open Access Journals is set up
- 2005 University OA-policy
- 2006 Implementation plan
- 2007 Mandatory registration of all university publications

- Continue building library competence
- Increase information and educational efforts
- High-quality infrastructure
